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- 4. The discussions and conclusions drawn by the authors must be reasonable and supportable.
- 5. The information must be relevant and interesting to area of research.

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Conclusions: conclude the study linking back to the aim of the study.

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Should be about 10-25 pages long, contain up-to-date information, comprehensively cover relevant literature and preferably be written by scientists who have in-depth knowledge on the topic. All format requirements are same as those applicable to full papers. Review articles need not be divided into sections such as materials and Methods and Results and Discussion, but should definitely have an Abstract, Keywords and Introduction, Conclusions & References if necessary.

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New / interesting / very rare cases can be reported. Cases with clinical significance or implications will be given priority, whereas, mere reporting of a rare case may not be considered.

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Case Report: Chief complaint, History, Clinical features, Radiographic and other investigation findings, Diagnosis, treatment plan and prognosis.

Discussion: Emphasize the new and important aspects of the Case and the conclusions that follow from them. Do not repeat in detail data or other material given in the Introduction section. Relate observations to other reports in the literature and point out the implications of the findings and their observations.

Conclusions: Link the conclusions with the goals of the case but avoid unqualified statements and conclusions not adequately supported by the data.

References: All references must be cited in the text as superscript & numbered in order of appearance and should appear in numeric sequence, at the end. Do not include unpublished data or personal communications in the reference list. Cite such references parenthetically in the text and include a date.

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Up to 1500 words excluding references and abstract and up to 10-15 references. The journal publishes exciting findings, preliminary data or studies that did not yield enough information to make a full paper as short communications. These have the same format requirements as full papers but are only up to 10 pages in length in total. Short Communications should not have subtitles such as Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results and Discussion, all these have to be merged into the running text. Short Communications preferably should have only 3-4 illustration.

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- 1. Should be a short and decisive observation.
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figures should be brief, but complete and self- explanatory so that the reader can easily understand the results presented in the figure.
